

Regulatory Circular RG14-173

RE: Restrictions on Transactions in Forest Oil Corporation (FST)

Effective December 17, 2014, Forest Oil Corporation (FST) will be delisted from the NYSE and will move its listing to the Other-OTC market under the symbol FSTO. Therefore, trading in FSTO options will be subject to restrictions.

Trading on CBOE in existing series of FSTO options will be subject to the following restrictions. Only closing transactions may be affected in any series FSTO options except for (i) opening transactions by Market-Makers executed to accommodate closing transactions of other market participants and (ii) opening transactions by CBOE TPH organizations to facilitate the closing transactions of public customers executed as crosses pursuant to and in accordance with CBOE Rule 6.74(b) or (d).

The execution of opening transactions in FSTO options, except as permitted above, and/or the misrepresentation as to whether an order is opening or closing, will constitute a violation of CBOE rules, and may result in disciplinary action. TPH organizations should ensure that they have appropriate procedures in place to prevent their customers from entering opening orders in this restricted option class. In addition, transactions in contravention of this restriction may be subject to nullification pursuant to Exchange Rule 6.25.

There are no restrictions in place with respect to the exercise of FSTO options.

In addition, effective December 17, 2014 the Automated Improvement Mechanism (AIM) will be deactivated in all series of Forest Oil Corporation (FSTO). Any reactivation of AIM in the above-listed class in the future will be announced via Regulatory Circular.
