RE: Restrictions on Transactions in Hercules Offshore, Inc. (HERO)

Effective August 24, 2015, Hercules Offshore, Inc. (HERO) will be delisted from the NASDAQ Global Select Market and will move its listing to the Other-OTC market under the symbol HEROQ. The HERO option symbol will remain the same for one day and change to HEROQ effective for Tuesday, August 25, 2015. Therefore, trading in HERO options on August 24, 2015 and trading in HEROQ options commencing on August 25, 2015 will be subject to restrictions.

Trading on CBOE in existing series of HERO/HEROQ options will be subject to the following restrictions. Only closing transactions may be affected in any series HERO/HEROQ options except for (i) opening transactions by Market-Makers executed to accommodate closing transactions of other market participants and (ii) opening transactions by CBOE TPH organizations to facilitate the closing transactions of public customers executed as crosses pursuant to and in accordance with CBOE Rule 6.74(b) or (d).

The execution of opening transactions in HERO/HEROQ options, except as permitted above, and/or the misrepresentation as to whether an order is opening or closing, will constitute a violation of CBOE rules, and may result in disciplinary action. TPH organizations should ensure that they have appropriate procedures in place to prevent their customers from entering opening orders in this restricted option class. In addition, transactions in contravention of this restriction may be subject to nullification pursuant to Exchange Rule 6.25.

There are no restrictions in place with respect to the exercise of HERO/HEROQ options.
