Item 3. <u>Self-Regulatory Organization's Statement of the Purpose of, and Statutory Basis for, the Proposed Rule Change</u>

(a) Purpose

The Exchange proposes to amend its Fees Schedule. Specifically, the Exchange proposes to increase the Linkage Routing fee from \$0.65 per contract to \$0.70 per contract in addition to the applicable C2 taker fee. The Linkage Routing fee is assessed to all orders routed pursuant to the Options Order Protection and Locked/Crossed Market Plan. The purpose of the proposed change is to help offset the costs associated with routing orders through Linkage and paying the transaction fees for such executions at other exchanges.

(b) Statutory Basis

The Exchange believes the proposed rule change is consistent with the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Act") and the rules and regulations thereunder applicable to

the Exchange and, in particular, the requirements of Section 6(b) of the Act.¹ Specifically, the Exchange believes the proposed rule change is consistent with Section 6(b)(4) of the Act,² which requires that Exchange rules provide for the equitable allocation of reasonable dues, fees, and other charges among its Trading Permit Holders and other persons using its facilities.

In particular, the Exchange's proposal to increase the Linkage Routing fee from \$0.65 per contract to \$0.70 per contract is reasonable because such increase will help offset the costs associated with routing orders through Linkage and paying the transaction fees for such executions at other exchanges. The Exchange believes the proposed increase is equitable and not unfairly discriminatory because it will apply to all orders routed via Linkage.

Item 4. <u>Self-Regulatory Organization's Statement on Burden on Competition</u>

C2 does not believe that the proposed rule change will impose any burden on competition that is not necessary or appropriate in furtherance of the purposes of the Act. In particular, the increase to the Linkage Routing Fee will apply equally to all orders routed via linkage and will help offset costs associated with routing orders via linkage.
